The Doctor of Nursing Practice–Nurse Anesthesia Degree Program at UC Davis is a post-baccalaureate program that prepares experienced critical care nurses with the advanced skills and knowledge necessary to practice as nurse anesthetists to the full scope of their licensure. The DNP-NA program is a three-year hybrid program that integrates online didactic courses with in-person simulation and clinical rotations. Through immersive learning experiences, including state-of-the-art simulation training, and diverse clinical rotations, students are well-prepared for the demands of the profession. The program aims to cultivate a generation of nurse anesthetists who lead with excellence, compassion and a commitment to the delivery of state of the art evidence based anesthesia care to the community.
